Processing your visa application

- Book an appointment online by visiting the following website: <https://visa.vfsglobal.com/sen/en/che>
- Payment can be made by POS or Bank transfer or QR Code payment (XOF) during the appointment. Please check the exact visa fee on VFS website <https://visa.vfsglobal.com/sen/en/che> before the appointment.
- Processing a Schengen visa application takes at least 15 days once the application reaches the Embassy (no fast track available).
- Applicants must appear in person at the VFS Switzerland Visa Application on the appointment date
- All documents need to be submitted on paper A4.
- Application form needs to be signed by parents or legal guardian (if parents not available) for minors.
- In accordance with Art. 25a of the Visa Code (cooperation on the readmission of irregular migrants) and based on a report of the European Commission, Schengen area Member States to temporarily adopt an implementing decision with respect to The Gambia. This means that the processing time of the application is at least 45 days for Gambian nationals.

Admissibility Criteria

Please note: If the admissibility criteria outlined below are not fully met, your visa application will be deemed inadmissible. In such cases, the Embassy of Switzerland will according to Art. 9(3) Visacode:

- Return your application form and any documents you submitted.
- Destroy any biometric data collected during the application process.
- Reimburse the visa fee;
- Cease further examination of your application.

If your sponsor is not a commonly known Swiss or multi-national company, also hotel confirmation(s), trade license and bank statement (last 3 (three) months is required). Note for children and spouses of Swiss and EU/EFTA nationals

Points 9, 10, 11, 12, 15 do not apply. Instead, please include the following documents: copy of valid Swiss or EU/EFTA passport (of spouse/parent) and proof of family relation (copy of marriage for birth certificate, legalized by the competent UAE/Bahrain authorities).



Important Information

For all types of Schengen visas, the processing time is 15 days. During the visa processing time, no passport withdrawal is possible.

The Embassy of Switzerland explicitly reserves the right

- to request more information or additional documents and/or a personal interview.
- to verify the contents and authenticity of the documents presented.
- to send the application to the Swiss Federal Authority for decision.
- to refuse a visa based on incorrect/false/incomplete declarations or on forged documents.

Passing the border

The border authorities are obliged to examine whether the conditions for the traveller's entry still apply. If the prerequisites for entry no longer apply or if you are unable to provide the relevant evidence, you may be refused entry although you are in possession of a valid visa. **It is therefore strongly recommended that you carry copies of the documents which you supplied with your visa application.**
